Receive advanced care at home

You now have the option to receive advanced care safely at home, after being clinically stable and no longer requiring care in a hospital setting. Thanks to state-of-the-art technology and specialized care teams, eligible patients can choose to receive care in the comfort of their home by enrolling in Cedars-Sinai @ Home.



If you and your doctor agree this program is right for you and you decide that you want to participate in the program, we'll arrange to take you home—or to the house of a loved one, if that's where you'll be receiving care. Our team will set up the home to get it ready for advanced care. Once that's done, here's what you can expect from Cedars-Sinai @ Home while you're enrolled in the program:

- 24/7 access to care
- Home visits and virtual appointments
- Remote monitoring of your vital signs
- A special command center led by doctors and other healthcare professionals who coordinate your care
- A technology kit, available to you while you're enrolled in the program and used exclusively for your care, that makes it easy to connect with your care team and that helps them track how you're doing
- Medical equipment such as a bed, shower chair, blood pressure monitor, pulse oximeter and more, also available to you while you're enrolled in the program and used exclusively for your care
- Tests including lab work
- Pharmacy/medication management, including IV therapies
- Interpreter services, if needed
- Personalized daily schedule

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: What level of care can I expect at home after I'm discharged from the hospital?

A: Cedars-Sinai @ Home is designed to make sure patients safely get the same quality of care you've come to expect from Cedars-Sinai, with the added comfort of being at home.

Q: Can I go out while I'm receiving care at home?

A: Your care team will talk to you about whether it is safe to leave your home while receiving care. For some conditions, your care team may recommend that you stay at home while enrolled in the program.

Q: How long will I need to receive care at home?

A: Everyone's care plan will be unique to their situation. While typical enrollment is about five days, your care team will talk to you about your specific care plan, including how long you can expect to be cared for at home.

Q: Will medical professionals be coming to my home often?

A: Although many of your services will be video-based, a specially trained clinician will visit your home to deliver care in person when needed. This may even happen a few times a day. The visits are usually scheduled ahead of time, so you can plan to have someone at your home to let them in.

Q: Do people who live with me need to know about this program?

A: Yes, it's very important for everyone who lives with you to know that we're providing advanced care for you at home. Please talk to them before deciding to enroll in Cedars-Sinai @ Home. It's easier if everyone is on board and if they know medical professionals will be coming by.

Q: Will all of my care happen at home?

A: Most of our patients stay at home until they recover. If you don't improve as expected, we'll help you get back to Cedars-Sinai so you can be admitted. There are also some tests, such as CT scans, that have to be done at the hospital. If you need that type of test, we'll take you there and back home.

Q: Is Cedars-Sinai @ Home more expensive than being at the hospital?

A: The program accepts all patients regardless of insurance status. The Cedars-Sinai @ Home team can explain more about costs when you're in the hospital and deciding if you want to enroll in Cedars-Sinai @ Home.

Q: What if I start Cedars-Sinai @ Home but change my mind?

A: You can ask to leave the program at any time. Our doctors will find a safe alternative and help switch your care.
