Description

This is a combined inpatient/ outpatient/ stroke service for Neurology. Students have an opportunity to evaluate and work up a variety of commonly seen neurological conditions including stroke, seizures, altered mental status, multiple sclerosis, neurobehaviour, neuromuscular, headache and movement disorders. The team consists of neurology,medicine/ anesthesia/ neurosurgery residents, ^{2nd} year medical students and a faculty member. . Students will take part in multiple didactic sessions including weekly lectures, seminars, and grand round presentations.

Course Objectives

- Ability to obtained pertinent history and perform detailed neurological examination to localize abnormalities within the nervous system.
- Develop comprehensive differential diagnosis and prioritize appropriate workup for patients with neurological disease.
- Discuss risks and benefits of medications commonly used for neurological disease.
- Work effectively as part of a healthcare team.
- Identify and utilize community resources for patients with neurological disorders.
- · Develop and deliver a brief oral presentation to the team
