During the rotation in pediatric infectious diseases, you will be exposed to a variety of inpatient and outpatient infectious disease issues. You will learn to approach infectious disease problems in an organized and systematic way and learn rational use of antibiotics. This will benefit you in any medical specialty and expose you to all parts of the pediatric service: wards, NICU, PICU, and Infectious Diseases Outpatient Clinic.

Course Objectives

- 1. Evaluation and treatment of common community-acquired infectious disease problems of pediatric inpatients and outpatients.
- 2. Exposure to infectious diseases in immune-compromised patients
- 3. Introduction to Infection control in Pediatrics.
- 4. Use of the clinical microbiology laboratory.
- 5. Judicious use of antimicrobial agents and Antimicrobial Stewardship.
- 6. Management of Pediatric patients with MIS-C and Kawasaki Disease
