Description

The Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) is a 45- bed unit. The student will have the opportunity to learn evaluation and management of preterm and term infants with a variety of medical and surgical diagnoses. The student will work on the teaching team with Neonatology faculty and fellow. This will include daily rounds, multidisciplinary discharge rounds, perinatal meetings with obstetrics staff, and prenatal consultations. This experience includes participation in several educational activities within the NICU and the Department of Pediatrics Grand Rounds and Case Conferences.

Course Objectives

- 1. Demonstrate understanding of normal physiology of term and preterm neonates
- 2. Become competent at examining newborns of varying gestational ages and acuity
- Understand the pathophysiology common neonatal disease 3.
- Understand management of the critically ill neonate, including 4. interpretation of labs and imaging
- Demonstrate the ability to communicate effectively with the NICU 5. team, subspecialists, and parents of patients
