Description

This elective will provide medical students with a rich experience in the interface between medicine and psychiatry at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center. Identification and treatment of psychiatric disorders due to general medical conditions, substance/medication induced psychiatric disorders. This elective is more suitable for medical students who are interested in strengthening their medico-psychiatric skills in a large general hospital setting. Medical students will be expected to review Consultation-Liaison articles for discussion. Students interested in research will have the opportunity to attend research activities related to Psychiatry-Medicine and Substance Use research projects and contribute to publications as a co-author.

Course Objectives

- 1. Knowledge and understanding on the biopsychosocial model of disease.
- 2. Knowledge of specific disease processes and coping techniques demonstrated by patients.
- Basic science program designed to provide a comprehensive understanding of clinical psychopharmacology.
- 4. The learning of detailed history taking and psychiatric evaluation of patients with organic disorders.
- 5. Knowledge of correct and appropriate consultation techniques.
- 6. Knowledge of the basic elements of supportive psychotherapy.
- Knowledge of effective liaison relationship with the multidisciplinary health care team, as well as with family members and caregivers.
- 8. Knowledge of the doctor/patient relationship.
- 9. Knowledge of the theoretical aspects of psychosomatic disorders.
- 10. Knowledge of the basic approach to disposition and follow-up planning.
- 11. Participate in research activities including data interpretation, manuscript drafting and co-authorship.
